# Executive Summary/ DOD Implementation of ARRA 2009

## Department of Defense (DoD) Implementation

The Recovery Act includes approximately \$7.4 billion in Defense-related appropriations - less than 1% of the total \$787 billion stimulus package signed on February 17, 2009.

### **The DOD intends to spend its funds as quickly as possible in the following categories:**

- \$4.2 billion in Operation and Maintenance accounts to improve, repair, and modernize DoD facilities, including energy-related improvements
- \$1.3 billion in military construction for hospitals
- \$240 million in military construction for child development centers
- \$100 million in military construction for warrior transition complexes
- \$535 million for other military construction projects, such as housing for the troops and their families, energy conservation, and National Guard facilities
- \$300 million to develop energy-efficient technologies
- \$120 million for the Energy Conservation Investment Program (ECIP)
- \$555 million for a temporary expansion of the Homeowner's Assistance Program (HAP) benefits for private home sale losses of both DoD military and civilian personnel
- \$15 million for DoD Inspector General oversight and audit of Recovery Act execution

## **Recovery.Gov: Roadmap to Recovery – MILCON goals – June 2009**

- **In the Next 100 Days: Initiate 2,300 construction and rehabilitation projects at 359 military facilities across the nation.**

The Department of Defense seeks to provide the men and women of the United States Military with housing, medical care, and family support facilities worthy of their commitment to our nation's security and way of life. Department of Defense projects will make building safety improvements, repair and improve personnel living quarters, and begin solar energy projects at over 350 military installations throughout the country.

– **Examples of projects are as follows:**

- The Wounded Warrior Transition Center at Fort Bliss, TX, will help our wounded soldiers returning from active duty with their transition to productive lives here at home. Services will include physical rehabilitation, housing, transition assistance, and a variety of other support services.
- Military barracks and housing renovation projects will upgrade living quarters significantly deteriorated from age and high occupancy. Many are in need of major repairs. These projects will provide modern and efficient housing for military service members, thereby greatly improving their quality of life.
- Solar power generation projects will increase energy output and reduce the costs associated with energy production and electrical equipment maintenance at military installations across the country.

## FY09 War Supplemental Approps. Bill – Update 6/11/09

- Over the past two weeks, leadership in the House and Senate have been actively negotiating a conference agreement for the nearly \$100 billion FY09 War Supplemental Appropriations Bill – the majority of which will fund military operations in Iraq and Afghanistan through October 1, 2009.
- Along with wartime spending that includes funding for personnel, equipment and military construction; the supplemental will also finance ongoing State Dept. activities and other issues such as pandemic flu efforts and border security.
- Although the key spending items contained in the \$96.7 billion House bill and the \$91.3 billion Senate bill remain similar (chart comparisons follows), bill movement has been delayed due to controversy surrounding a Senate provision that prohibits the release of sensitive photographs of U.S. detainees. Additionally, the inclusion of an administration request of \$5 billion for the International Monetary Fund (IMF) has drawn unanimous opposition from the Republican caucus.
